2	Robert Carville	Plea Agreement/Pleaded guilty to allegedly storing hazardous waste without a permit
2	Fuel Bio One LLC	Biodiesel fuel company sentenced for allegedly discharging more than 45,000 gallons of wastewater from its commercial biodiesel fuel production facility
2	Jose Rivera (Terminix)	Sentencing/Former Branch Manager sentenced to 12 months in prison for allegedly illegally applying fumigants containing methyl bromide in multiple residential locations in the U.S. Virgin Islands
3	Timothy Peer	Indictment/Indicted by a federal grand jury for allegedly violating permits and discharging untreated sewage from his sewage
3	David Klepadlo, David D. Klepadlo and Assoc., Inc.	Plea Agreement/Pleaded guilty to allegedly making false statements in violation of the Clean Water Act and tampering with a government witness.
3	Water and	Indictment/161 criminal charges filed for allegedly failing to notify residents when the agency replaced lead water lines – creating health risks for affected households; charged with allegedly failing to sample water lines following the

		replacements within the time frame required under state law.
3	Mike Blankenship	Sentencing/Sentenced to 15 months in prison for alleged Clean Water Act violations
5	IAV GmbH (Volkswagen)	Plea Agreement/Plead guilty to one criminal felony count and pay a \$35 million criminal fine as a result of the company's alleged role in a long-running scheme for Volkswagen AG (VW) to sell diesel vehicles in the United States by using a defeat device to cheat on U.S. vehicle emissions tests required by federal law.
5	Kenneth R. Morrison	Plea Agreement/Convicted of alleged interstate transportation of stolen goods
5	Gary Alfred Sayers, Electro- Plating Services, Inc.	Plea Agreement/Plead guilty in federal court to allegedly illegally storing hazardous wastes at the company's premises in Madison Heights, Michigan, in knowing violation of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.
5	Mark Harris	Plea Agreement/Pleaded guilty in U.S. District Court to allegedly knowingly failing to remove asbestos in a South Point, Ohio electric power plant.
5	Richard Baude, Axel Eiser, Stefan Knirsh, Carsten Nagel, (Audi)	Indictment/Charged for their roles in the nearly decade-long alleged conspiracy to defraud U.S. regulators and U.S. Customers by implementing software specifically designed to cheat U.S. emissions tests in tens of thousands of Audi "clean diesel" vehicles.
5	Tier Environmental LLC	Plea Agreement/Pleaded guilty to a single felony charge of allegedly recklessly violating a hazardous waste permit issued under Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code.
5	Mohamed	Indictment/Indicted on charges of allegedly illegally accepting food stamps at seven Cleveland-area gas stations, laundering the profits, illegally having firearms, operating an unregulated slaughterhouse, and polluting a stream by dumping animal blood and fluids in it.
7	Steven Weaver	Sentencing/Sentenced to two years of probation for allegedly purchasing and renovating former Kossuth County Home without thoroughly inspecting for asbestos.
7	Ahmed El-Sherif	Sentencing/Ordered to pay \$544,287 in restitution for allegedly storing hazardous waste without a license.
9	James Phillip Lucero	Sentencing/Sentenced to 30 months in prison for the alleged unpermitted discharge of pollutants into waters of the United States, including wetlands.
