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U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Compliance Requirements for Sale of E15 Gasoline Blends: Mark Morgan (Petroleum Marketers Association of America Compliance Bulletin)

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Petroleum Marketers Association of America ("PMAA") Regulatory Counsel Mark Morgan authored a June 28th Compliance Bulletin titled:

EPA Compliance Requirements for Sale of E15 Gasoline Blends ("Bulletin")

PMAA is a national trade association based in Washington, D.C.

The *Bulletin* notes that the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") promulgated the final changes to the relevant regulations that allow gasoline blended with up to 15% ethanol ("E15") to utilize 1-psi Reid Vapor Pressure ("RVP") waiver. This waiver currently applies to E10 during the summer months. As Mr. Morgan notes:

E15 could only be sold during the winter driving season. With the EPA's latest rule, E15 may now be sold year-round beginning June 5, 2019, subject to certain regulatory requirements.
