Methylene Chloride/Toxic Substances Control Act: Environmental Labor Organizations File Judicial Petition Challenging U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Risk Decision

07/21/2020

The Sierra Club and a number of other environmental and labor organizations filed a July 16th Petition for Review ("Petition") addressing a United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") decision under the Toxic Substances Control Act regarding methylene chloride.

The decision challenges EPA's determination that methylene chloride does not present an unreasonable risk of injury to health or the environment under certain conditions of use.
