Beaver Watershed Alliance will be hosting a Quarterly Speaker Series on Thursday, February 20th from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm at the AT&T Conference Room at the Engineering Research Center, 535 W. Research Center Blvd., Fayetteville. The guest speaker will be Jane Maginot, Washington County Extension Agent for water quality. Jane will be speaking on the nature of stormwater and will provide a general overview of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Program for the State.

Stormwater runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snow-melt flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalk, streets, and parking lots prevent stormwater from naturally soaking into the ground. Stormwater acts like a magnet, picking up everything in its path and then carrying it, usually untreated, into our storm drain systems to local streams, rivers, lakes, and wetlands. This runoff contains pollutants such as oil, sediment, litter, pet waste, chemicals, and fertilizers, which can impact Beaver Lake, the drinking water source for one-in-six Arkansans. Learn about what stormwater is, how it moves, and what are the MS4 regulations on stormwater in Northwest Arkansas and around the state.

Developers and contractors, engineering and environmental professionals, land managers, elected officials, decision-makers, and landowners who want to learn more about stormwater and its impacts on our water supply are encouraged to attend the Speaker Series on February 20th.

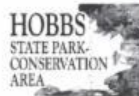
